SECRETARY LANDRY CALLS FOR ADDITIONAL ELECTION COMMISSIONERS

BATON ROUGE, La. — Louisiana Secretary of State Nancy Landry is asking members of the public to sign up to work as Election Day poll commissioners for the 2nd Party Primary on June 27 and the U.S. Senate General and Open Primary Election on Nov. 3.

Louisiana needs more election workers to ensure that all of the state’s Election Day voting precincts operate without interruption or delay. Commissioners can earn up to \$200, and commissioners-in-charge can earn up to \$350, depending on certification level and number of precinct assignments.

Election Day poll commissioners must be:

- A registered voter in Louisiana
- Attend a 1-2 hour training course
- At least 17 years old and a high school senior or older
- Work the entire election day (6 a.m. - 8 p.m.), arriving at least 30 minutes to 1 hour before polls open and remaining until everything is finalized after polls close. You are unable to leave the precinct during your shift.

“Poll commissioners are the backbone of Louisiana’s election process,” said Secretary Landry. “Their commitment helps ensure voters have a smooth experience at the polls and that elections are conducted with integrity. We are looking for individuals who want to serve their communities, support the democratic process, and earn extra income while playing an important role on Election Day.”

Prospective election workers must return their completed applications to their parish Clerk of Court’s office. Applicants will then be contacted with the next steps in the process. More information about qualifications and training is available on the Louisiana Secretary of State’s [website](#).
